

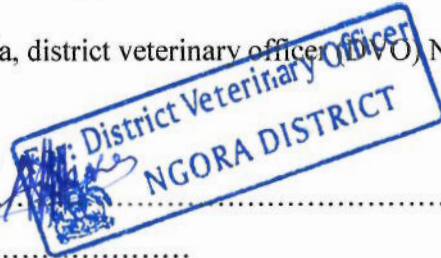

## **ABSTRACT**

This report is a compilation of what I learnt and did during my farm and community practice, which prevailed for weeks under the department of production in Ngora district local government. Ngora district is a district located in Teso sub-region in the eastern parts of Uganda. The farm practice is a necessity for partial fulfillment of a requirement for the award of a degree Bachelor of Animal Production and Management. The training was carried out with the objectives of exposing students to various farm enterprises and community hence strengthening their extension competence and capability in areas of communication, planning and community interactions, give students chance to have hands on experience in relation to animal production, enable students relate class work for filed situations and introduce students to basic research concept.

## CHAPTER ONE

### 1.0 INTRODUCTION



#### 1.1 Location

Ngora District is found in the Eastern part of Uganda (Teso sub-region) it is bordered by Soroti City to the northwest, Katakwi District to the northeast, Kumi District to the east Pallisa District to the south, and Serere District to the west. The district headquarters at Ngora are located approximately 23 kilometers (14 miles) by road west of Kumi. This location lies approximately 230 kilometers (140 miles) by road northeast of Kampala, the capital city of Uganda. The coordinates of the district are 01 30N, 33 48E.

#### 1.2 Administrative back ground

Ngora District was established on 1 July 2010 by the parliament of Uganda. Before that it was part of Kumi District. Ngora district is named after its chief municipal, commercial and administrative center Ngora. The district is made up of the former county of Ngora, which in turn is made up of the sub-counties of Kafir (Okapel), Kobuin, Mukura, Ngora and Ngora town council.

The district headquarters is located in Ngora town council. The district is made up of 69 parishes and 137 villages
