ABSTRACT

This industrial training report contains activities carried out at Soroti district local government for a period of 2 months and 2 weeks. The activities implemented were categorized into three sections i.e., office work, field work and meat inspection (public health).

This report exponentially documents these activities as explained in the four chapters that include the following.

Chapter one introduces us to the place of attachment; location of SDLG, historical overview, soil vegetation and climate of the area of attachment, economic context, settlement patterns, ethnicity, administration, organizational structure of district production and marketing department and objectives of the veterinary sector.

Chapter two describes activities implemented during the attachment period which includes; field, office work and public health.

Chapter three explains more about impact of attachment which includes; skills gained during the training, responsibility under taken during the training, the influence of the training to the future carrier plan and how the industrial training activities carried are correlated with lecture room knowledge.

Then finally chapter four takes us to conclusion of the report and recommendations to be put in place.

CHAPTER ONE INTRODUCTION

1.1 Industrial training

Industrial training is a practical course module where students are sent out in different institutes, firm, farms or organizations at every end of first year of study to explore and gain experience in different fields as far as our IT is concerned it run for a period of two months and two weeks. I caried out my training at Soroti district local government in veterinary sector under supervision of veterinary production officer.

1.2 Background of Soroti district

The District Veterinary Office is under the local government dealing in aspects of animal (livestock). The activities carried out were done according to the work plan designed by the field supervisor. This work plan was designed on the first day of reporting, capturing three (3) areas; office work, Abattoir and field. I participated in all the three categorized activities.

1.3 Location of Soroti district veterinary office

Soroti district veterinary office is located in Soroti district, Soroti municipality, central cell opposite and Soroti sports ground.

1.4 Historical Background of Soroti district local government

The growth of Soroti dates as far back as 1904 when the district commissioner of Mbale sent Kakungulu to open up some administration units in Serere, Gweri and Soroti areas, parts of Kakugulu's team camped near the rock at Soroti and settled there. The choice of this site was a camping site and was probably influenced by the availability of good drinking water from the nearby streams and the fact that the rock had some advantages in the matter of dams for settlers from the local inhabitants around under the organized and rule of Kakungulu.

Local inhabitants were forced to clear the forests and within a few days, a large area had been cleared and considerable amount of settlement had taken place. Thatched houses for administrative purposes of Soroti County were put, stands and dispensaries in temporally materials stood at the site of present Soroti hospital.
