ABSTRACT.

The industrial training was carried out for duration of 2 months and 2 weeks from 28th of February to 6th of May 2022 under a Missionaries project at St. Martin Comboni Missionaries in Palorinya, Obongi district.

It's a practical aspect of learning aimed at equipping students with skills and exposes them to various challenges faced at Field.

There are number of activities carried out includes orientation, identification of sections of the farm, identifying the location of the farm, measuring the dimension of the farm (garden area), identifying of crop varieties/ species, identifying soil types, cleaning animal units, checking body temperature of animals, measuring the heartbeat of animals, feeding animals, giving water to animals, formulation of feeds for animals, removal of old litter and replacing with new once from the piggery unit and disinfecting it, treat animals, disinfecting wounds on animals, weeding of vegetables, in nursery bed, the seed bed, removing of trash from the garden, seed bed preparation, transplanting of vegetables seedling, irrigation of seedling, creating drainage channels on the farm garden, determining the moisture content of sun flower seeds, cleaning sunflower seeds, grinding and milling of sun flower seeds, Purifying and refining of sun flower oil, filtering sun flower oil, packaging and branding sun flower oil, briquette making, energy saving stove construction, cleaning the drainage channels for animals, feeding of piglets(bottle feeding), checking pressure of the tyres of the tractor, warming the tractor engines, starting the tractor, checking the engine parts, topping up water in the radiator, lubricating the engine parts, maintaining the tillage implements,

1.0 CHAPTER ONE; INTRODUCTION

1.1 Background of the study

Martin –Comboni Missionaries is a Faith-Based Organization (FBO) registered to offer social and economic services to refugees and host communities in Moyo and Obongi District in Uganda. The organization has a long history of working with refugees and host communities in providing specialized vocational skilling and job apprenticeships to young women and men (a process of building resilience through providing formal skills development and training to young people for self- employment) in Uganda and other countries.

Comboni Missionaries provide non-formal competence-based vocational training and apprenticeships in brick laying and and concrete practice, carpentry and joinery, bakery, metal fabrication, electric repair and maintenance, sunflower processing, hairdressing, tailoring and briquette making in line with the skilling Uganda strategy 2016-2021.

1.2 BACK GROUND

St. Martin Comboni missionaries Operates in Kajo- Keji, south Sudan and it wasestablished in 1996. When civil war broke out in south Sudan in December 2016, Comboni missionaries were forced to relocate operations to the refugee settlement in Palorinya in the district of Obongi formally Moyo district and another district in northern Uganda in 2017 and continue to transport Capital, Operations and machinery to a new base of operations located on 30 acres of land in Palorinya-Obongi, in order to continue serving the south Sudanese refugees and the host community who have welcomed them in Uganda. Comboni Missionaries built a Centre close to the refugee's settlement in order to continue their development activities in those areas. They offer training and skills
