

1.0 INTRODUCTION

Toughline enterprise limited is one of the agricultural business entities in the northern part of Uganda located 4.5km south of Lira at Adidikgweno village Boker Parish. It is a sole proprietor farm that is owned by Mr Doi Fredrick. There are six enterprises on the farm piggery, poultry, apiary, horticulture, forestry, nurserybed, resourcecentre. The main current activities carried out are; management of one acre mother garden of clones.
