

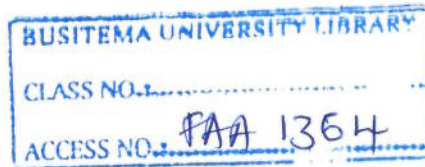

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ABSTRACT

This report contains and describes the activities implemented, skills and qualifications gained, challenges faced during the industrial training, conclusion of the report and recommendations derived from the challenges faced at Kuju sub county, Amuria District Local Government. The objective of this industrial training was to make students benefit from the skills and knowledge gained from the fields, apply the knowledge they get from the lecture room, in the field and build confidence in the students. During internship I was attached to the department of production. This was followed by orientation where I was first introduced to the subcounty animal husbandry officer and later I implemented the activities such as; vaccinations of poultry and animals, spraying of animals, deworming, meat inspection and Training of farmers on animal management, farm visits, animal treatment, disease surveillance, monitoring and evaluation in all the parishes. These activities have made me to gain a lot of skills and knowledge like; Deworming of goats, pigs and cattle, skills in spraying, skills in general management of animals, communication skills and confidence in training farmers on animal management, During internship, I also face some challenges like; poor mobilization of the farmer, lack of veterinary drugs and equipment at the Sub County, limited transport means for field work in the production department and poor turn up of the farmers to the training. In conclusion all the activities were implemented and industrial training was carried out successfully. I was able to get practical skills and knowledge in line with my career and relating with people in the field. The technical advice that I provided helped address farmers' problems and concerns. there were also some few challenges which hindered the smooth running of the activities making me recommend that proper mobilization of farmers must improve for the training programs to solve problems of poor turn up during such activities, government should increase the number of motorcycles to solve transport problems and acquire more equipment and veterinary drugs to be installed so that animals are treated and vaccinated in time.

1.3 Background of Kuju Sub County

1.3.1 Location and area

Kuju Sub County Local is located on the North Eastern west part of Uganda and its headquarters is located in ocaunakolong village Kuju parish, with the distance of 2kms from Amuria district headquarters, on Amuria -Orungo road. it borders Ogolai on the west, Tubur and Arapai from the south, Morungatuny on the north west, Obalanga on the north east and Willa on the east. it covers approximately 382.81sq.km. physically the subcounty lies between latitudes $1^{\circ} 35'$ to $1^{\circ} 41' 8''$ longitude $33^{\circ} 30'$ to $33^{\circ} 40'$. it's one of the subcounties that form Amuria County. It's surrounded by eight parishes which are; Kuju, Angorom, Atuba, Aojaikitoi, Obar, Amusus, Amilimili, Ayoga with 43 villages.

1.3.2 Political and administrative infrastructure

The Sub County is under the political leadership of the Lc3 who heads the governing council and the Executives. The Council is the sole decision-making body for the Sub County and its decisions are implemented by the Technical Planning Committee staff from various disciplines headed by the Sub County Chief. There are 2 Sectorial committees of the Sub County council each headed by a secretary (executive) namely; general purpose committee and Finance, Planning, Administration.

The beneficiaries are the PWD, HIV/AIDS group, Adult and Youth groups.
