

ABSTRACT

This report contains and describes the activities implemented, skills and knowledge gained, challenges faced during the industrial training, conclusion and recommendations derived from the challenges faced at Bugiri District Local Government. The objective of this industrial training was to make me benefit from the skills and knowledge gained from the fields, apply the knowledge I got from the classroom in the field and gain confidence. During internship I was attached to the department of animal production, Bugiri District Local Government. The department provided practical skills, field practice and experience to enhance the theoretical knowledge that is learnt in class. For example; Deworming of goats and cattle, Castration, general management of animals, communication skills and confidence in training farmers about animal management, During internship, I also faced some challenges like; poor mobilization of the farmers, limited transport means in the production department and poor turn up of the farmers for the trainings. In conclusion all the activities were implemented and industrial training was carried out successfully. I was in position of getting practical skills and knowledge in line with my career and relating with people in the field. The technical advice that I provided addressed farmers' problem and needs. CHAPTER ONE:INTRODUCTION

1.1 BACK GROUND INFORMATION

Bugiri district was originally a county of Iganga district, and was formed on the principle of decentralization policy of governance in 1997. The district has an estimated land area of 2629 sq. km of which 1,062 is dry land and the rest therefore is covered by water bodies.

1.2 LOCATION

Bugiri district is located in Eastern Uganda; Bugiri district is bordered by Namutumba district and Butaleja district to the north, Tororo district to the north east, Busia district to the east, Namayingo district to the south west and Bugweri district to the west. Bugiri district headquarters is located approximately 77 kilometers (48mi), by road east of Jinja, the largest city in busoga sub region. The co-ordinates of the district are: 00 33N, 3345E (Latitude: 0.5500, longitude: 33.7500)

1.3 MANDATE

The district was created by an Act of Parliament as a local government center and its mandate is derived from the constitution of the republic of Uganda and local government Act (CAP 243). Its legal existence and Mandate took effect on 1997

1.4 POPULATION

Bugiri district population stands at total of 390,076 persons of which 188,462 are males and 201,614 are females, these occupy 75921 households on an average of 5.1 per household in the district both rural and urban areas.

1.5 TOPOGRAPHY

Land is generally characterized by gentle undulating hills with few higher residual features and the major hills are irimbi, bululu and namakoko.

1.6 SOIL

Soils covering most of the district are mainly loamy and sand loams, the district has a total area of 2629 sq.km of which 1062 is dry land and rest therefore is covered by water bodies.
