ABSTRACT

During the period from 28th February to 6th May 2022, an industrial training was undertaken at Kalongo Town Council, Agago District Local Government to partially fulfill requirements for the programme leading to the award of a Bachelor's Degree in Animal Production and Management of Busitema University. The training started with orientation of interns at the Town Council and District Headquarters to acquaint students with the workplace. Field activities carried out fall under the core animal husbandry practices, animal traction, and veterinary public health. Under animal health management, activities done included vaccination of animals against diseases and disease diagnosis & treatment of sick food animals. Under animal feeding and nutrition, activities included animal feeds formulation, farmer training on animal feeds and feeding management, pasture selection & establishment, and iron supplementation of piglet as a remedy for piglet anaemias. Ear tagging and ear notching were the activities done under the context of animal identification. In animal breeding and reproduction, selection of breeding stocks, castration, oestrus induction & synchronisation and hand mating of sows were done. Activities done under record keeping included farmer trainings on record keeping and designing record sheets. Animal housing encompassed activities such as siting and designing animal houses and farmer training on animal house management & biosecurity. In animal traction, training of farmer groups on selection, training of traction animals and the care & welfare of oxen were done. In veterinary public health, activities done were ante mortem inspection of slaughter animals and post mortem inspection of carcasses. The industrial training gave me skills in veterinary extension service provision, diagnosis and management of common diseases of food animals, use of animal management tools, animal housing, and communication, leadership and management skills. The responsibilities I was assigned during the attachment included farmer trainings on modern animal husbandry practices, vaccinating animals, treatment sick food animals, provision of veterinary public health services, disease surveillance, and preparing & submitting activity reports to the supervisor. These activities have a positive influence on my future career as they gave me more professional skills. The activities positively correlate to my classroom knowledge since they were the practical versions of what I learnt in class. Conclusively, the training was successful and it gave me an interesting field experience due to the numerous activities I did and learnt and I recommend that the University should give more practical sessions to students to prepare them for field works.

CHAPTER ONE: INTRODUCTION

1.1. Introduction

As a requirement for partial fulfillment for the award of a Bachelor's Degree in Animal Production and Management of Busitema University, students are required to undergo industrial training for an indicated amount of time at relevant institutions/ organisations in order to equip them with the knowledge that prepares them through career development to enable them thrive and compete in the job market and accustom themselves to their professional works. This report gives an account of industrial training that was undertaken at Kalongo Town Council, Agago District in Northern Uganda from 28th February, 2022 to 6th May, 2022.

1.2. Background of the Institution

Kalongo Town Council is one of the sixteen lower administrative units of Agago District Local Government. It was curved out of Parabongo Sub-County located 15 kilometers north of Agago District Headquarters and came into effect on 1st July, 2010. Kalongo is located in the Acholi sub-region, approximately 78 kilometers (48miles) south east of Kitgum, the nearest large town. This is approximately 155 kilometers (96 miles) by road, north east of Gulu, the largest city in the sub-region. The coordinates of Kalongo, Uganda are 3°22,400" W. 38°22,16.00" E (latitude: 3.04000: longitude: 33.37111). The Town Council is bordered by Parabongo Sub-County to the north east and south west, Wol Sub-County in the north and west, Paimol Sub-County to the east. Kalongo Town Council covers approximately 24 square kilometers and is home to 11,594 people (UBOS, 2017).
