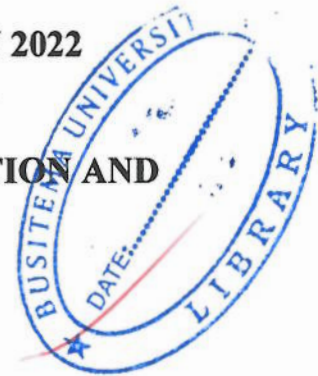

## ABSTRACT

The industrial training which is carried out is meant to expose a student to practical skills in the field environment to prove their employment and future studies to gain knowledge and skill in their relevant fields.

During the period of two months that is to say 28<sup>th</sup> February- 6<sup>th</sup> May 2022, I conducted my industrial training at Bugiri Municipal Council and Veterinary Doctor under production department being supervised by Dr. Kisige Bumali as the field supervisor,

Bugiri Municipal Council is located in the Northern part of Bugiri District along kampala-Tororo highway. It started operating as a Municipality in the year 2016. The production department was established with the aim of improving the production and productivity of livestock for example bovines, caprines, ovines, poultry, among others.

The department is headed by the M.P.O, M.V.O, M.A.O, Fisheries officer at the Municipality.

To achieve the above aim, I was involved in many field activities such as:

- Meat inspection; this was to ensure that any meat being sold to public for human consumption is safe to reduce the spread of Zoonotic diseases.
- Training of farmers; this was to encourage them to take farming as a business.
- Livestock Vaccination to prevent some diseases e.g. Newcastle disease in poultry.
- Monitoring of OWC inputs especially was done on cattle and sheep.
- Vaccination to prevent some diseases like Newcastle in poultry.
- Castration; this was to improve on the quality if animals and their products.
- Treatment of animals; this was to improve the general health of domestic animals. This was done under different section like; Deworming, Spraying, Diagnosis of disease, FMD and poultry Vaccination.

The above activities were carried successfully however among challenges included rigidity of farmers to adopt the proper modern animal husbandry practices, among others.

Therefore, I concluded that Animal production can be improved so as to be profitable if farmers follow all the proper management practices such as proper feeding, proper housing, providing adequate water, vaccination, treatment, deworming and spraying.

# CHAPTER ONE

## INTRODUCTION

### 1.0 Overview

This chapter has detailed information about the title of the organization, history of the organization, type of ownership, activities carried out by the organization, beneficiaries of the organization and departments in the organization

### 1.1 Title of the Organization

The title / name of the organization is Bugiri municipal council

### 1.2 History of the Organization

Bugiri Municipal Council which was elevated to its current status in July 2016 started as a cash crop producer particularly as a cotton buying center in a place called Ndifakulya in 1910. The present old sheets (Ebibaati) and block structures along the present Saza Road are relics of this trade. It was followed by the construction of a maize mill along the highway (Grant Street) by the Indians and the Arabs. Later, the two groups moved eastwards to build shops near the market place which was along the junction of Kirongero road and the highway. This place was called Busanzi from where the Town later grew and became known as Bugiri apparently the center of Bugiri Town.

In the Far East, there is a trailer parking yard called Naluwerere trailer park. It was started by one Anwar's garage. One Tanzanian trailer Driver called Nkindas Sam who built a Lodge which was named after him-Sam's Bar and Lodge in the 1960's.

Long distance drivers used the point as a refreshing/ leisure place. Soon the prostitutes also took advantage and now the place is known throughout East Africa as a town of sex traders compared to other prominent towns of Lyantonde district, Mbiko in Buyikwe District and Lukaya in Lwengo district.

In short, Bugiri Municipal Council is composed of four (4) wards joined together to make a Town that is to say, Ndifakulya, Bwole, Nkusi and Naluwerere. There were names of the traders who are believed to have been the founders of these trading centers such as Hussein, Suleiman, Shoonun, Mohammed, Muyonda Kirevu (Arabs), Gordon, Raligi (Indians) and Anwar (Half caste). These were their family names. Arabs built "Ebibaati" houses while Indians built block structures which were all commercial buildings in nature.

However, from 1969 the Indians started leaving Uganda following President Obote's scheme to the final economic war. The Indians sold off these structures to the Arabs. Soon after, the Arabs were joined by petty African business men. In 1981, the two trading centers of Bugiri and Busanzi were joined to form a Town Board. In 1994 the Town Board became a Town Council out of the NRM's Local Council system of participatory Democracy.

However, on 1<sup>st</sup> July, 2016, the Town Council was elevated to a Municipal Council status and at the time of completion of this report, the Town was already a municipality comprising of two divisions, that is to say, Eastern and Western.
