Since 2007 LFI has purchased land and developed projects in Telela, Omito Parish Lira.

Whereby over 56 local people have been employed to support the running of the project which

included Agricultural and vocational schools, Nursery and Primary schools, Children's village,

Visitor's center and Community Health Center. We Farm 140 hectares with a mixture of crop

and livestock.

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
