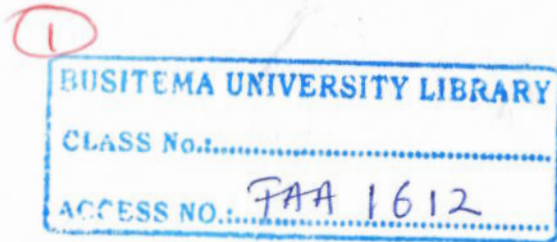

This field work was carried out at Buteza sub-county lower local government Sironko district

1.1 LOCATION

Buteza sub-county in terms of distance is 14 kilometers from Mbale town, situated on the slope of Namugabwe range in Budadiri west constituency Sironko district bordered by Bunyafwa sub-county in the north, Zesuisubcounty from the east, Bufumbo sub-county in the west (Mbale district) Bubyangu sub-county in the south

Buteza sub-county has four (4) parishes i.e. Bukahengere, Bumirisa, Bumukone & Bugwinbi making up 53 villages in total.
