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ABSTRACT

Industrial training is one of the modules done at Busitema University by all first year students in all academic programs. It was carriedout for a period of ten weeks from 16th may to 22nd july 2016 at Manafwa District Local Government under Production Department. The training was mainly conducted at the farms within the District ,Slaughter slabs, Laboratories and Cattle markets following the weekly programs ranging from Dairy production, Disease Investigation, Poultry production and management, Piggery production and management, different activities were carriedout such as Spraying of Livestock,Deworming, disease diagnosis and treatment,Raising of one day old chicks ,disinfecting the brooder house and other field and emergence cases.

Various skills were gained during the Industrial training including disease diagnosis, taking blood samples, collecting feacal samples, drenching techniques, raising of one day old chick and tagging of farm animals.

However, a number of challenges were also faced like walking of long distances to the farms, cattle market, slaughter slabs. Shortage of equipements and drugs for the animals. Poor quality of farm structures . Harsh climatical conditions like too much sunshine which affect livestock production.

In conclusion ,though the experience was gained in a wide areas of my career development, the District needs to improve on a number of facilities for better service delivery. The management of Production Department Manafwa District should construct better animal handling structures, stock appropriate drugs and install water for irrigation systems in the farm lands and also construct houses for accommodation of the internship students.



CHAPTER ONE

1.0 INTRODUCTION

Industrial training(IT) is one of the modules done in Busitema University Arapai campus.

It is done by all first year students of Certificate in general Agriculture(CGA), Diploma in Animal Production and Management(DAP) Diploma in Crop Production and Management (DCP) and Bachelor of Animal Production and Management (APM). This is done at the end of every second semester and is carriedout for a period of ten (10) weeks known as recess term after which a students writes a report and submits end of internship report for marking and performance grading.

1.1 BACKGROUND OF MANA DISTRICT LOCAL GOVERNMENT(MDLG)

Manafwa DAFWistrict Local Government came into existence in 2005 after being cut from Mbale District through the act of parliament before that it was part of Mbale together with Sironko in 2006, Manafwa District was further sub-divided into the current Bududa District.

Manafwa District has thirty (30) sub-counties, two (2) town councils, one hundred sixty four (164) parishes and one thousand four hundred seventy five (1475) villages with a population of Three hundred fifty five thousand four hundred seventy seven (355,477) people in 2014 census, It has a growth rate of 3.3% per annum the district has two (2) constituencies, Bubulo East and Bubulo West with three members of parliament and no Cabinet Minister but with only a State minister for Environment.

1.2 ECONOMIC ACTIVITY IN MDLG

The major economic activity in MDLG is Agriculture which is the backbone of the economy of the District and crops grown include: Arabic coffee, cotton, maize, beans, bananas, tomatoes, potatoes, millet, plus others, However the District continues to face development challenges because the vast majority of the people lives in the rural settings with low incomes and where service delivery is constrained beyond their control.
