ABSTRACT

This field attachment training has been carried out at alebtong district under department of production and marketing for a period of about three months the district is situated in lange-sub region northern Uganda and it is bordered by four district of LIRA, AMURIA DOKOLO and OTUKE. The District headquarter is located approximately 48km by road task of lira district 28km by road north of Kampala which is the capital city of Uganda, the coordinates of the district are 02.18N and 33.8E.

The district was created and become operational on the 1st July2010 and now it has 8 sub-counties of omoro, abako, Aloi, Awei, Amugu, abia, and Apala sub-county. The demography of the district in 1991 was 112600 and in 2012 it was 22600.

On the other hand the training has help me transforming theoretical knowledge in to practical knowledge, acquisition of leadership skills and record keeping.

Within the training season we carried many activities search as ante mortem & postmortem inspection, vaccination of pets and mass treatment of animal with required drugs, pregnancy diagnosis and also techniques of drug administration, carrying out livestock management practices like ear tagging, dehorning etc.

CHAPTER ONE

1.1 Introduction

The industrial training report carried out at alebtong district under the department of production and marketing in alebtong district. The district is situated in northern part of Uganda and it is named after chief town alebtong where the district head quarter is located.

1.2 Location

The district is located in lango sub region and in northern Uganda. It is bordered by four districts of Dokolo in the south, otuke in the north, lira in the west and Amuria in the east.

The head quarter is located approximately 30 miles (42km) by road is of lira and it lies approximately 28km (177miles) by road north of Kampala Uganda capital city. The coordination of the district is 02.18N, 33318E.

1.3 Overview

The district was created and has become operational on the 1st July, 2010 but prior to then was part of lira district, the sub region of lango composed of districts such as

Dokolo, Apac, Oyam, Lira Amolatar, Alebtong, Kole & Otuke.

Alebtong consist of the following sub counties abako Amugu omoro alebtong town council, awei aria Akura, & Aloi the sub-region has an estimate of 1.5 million people in 2002 according to national census carried in that year.

1.4 Demography/or population

In the year 1991, the national population census related the population of the district about 112600 and in the year 2002 the estimated population in the district in July 2002 was 226000.

1.5 Objectives of the training
