## ABSTRACT

This report contains and describes activities implemented, skills and qualifications gained, challenges faced during the training, conclusion of the report and recommendation derived from the challenges at kasajja stock farm, the objectives of this training is to equip students to benefit from the skills and knowledge gained from the field, apply the knowledge they get from the classroom into the field and create confidence in students. During the internship I was attached to the department of animal production. This was followed by orientation where I was first introduced to kasajja stock farm and later I implemented the activities such as dipping cattle to control external parasites, castration of bulls to avoid poor traits

## CHAPTER ONE: INTRODUCTION

### 1.0. Introduction

The industrial training was carried out at Kasajja stock farm from 28<sup>th</sup> Feb. 2022 to 6<sup>th</sup> April. 2022 where by a number of activities were carried out at the farm and which includes the following orientation, making work plan, cleaning milking parlour, dipping animals, pasture establishment, parasite control, fodder harvesting and feeding animals, calf management, castration, dehorning, fishing sampling, goat management, drug identification, pasture identification, hay making and apiculture. Internship is a course unit run by the universities for most of the programs. this is intended to equip students with field skills.

### 1.5 Background

Kasajja stock farm was established early 1970 with poultry farming and local zebu animals occupying 50 acres of land.

Then in 1982 five (5) exotic breeds of animals (freshens) and one (1) bull was introduced from Kenya. Now the farm has 149 cattle

The farm was founded by late Byakika Kasajja who was an agricultural officer as well as a politician and he was a member of parliament of Butaleja constituency which is now Butaleja district. He was shot in 1996 by unknown people when he was approaching his home just near the gate in Kabwangasi in Pallisa district and the farm is managed by his sons and daughters
