CHAPTER ONE

1.0 Introduction

1.1 Objectives of the Internship exercise

Lyama Town Council was planned to take off on 1st July 2018. However, due to administrative issues such as delay in recruitment of staff could not start its operations immediately? The council therefore started its operations in October 2021.

Important to note is that the sole objective was in support to decentralization to bring services nearer to the people—and create local support, participation of people amongst the local people.

Lyama Town Council is located in eastern part of Uganda found in Budaka District. It neighbours Budaka Town Council to the North, Nansanga Sub County to the West, Tademeri Sub County to the East and Butaleja district to the South. Lyama Town Council is situated 28 km off the Mbale- Iganga high way, North East of Kampala city. Lyama Town Council in Budaka District neighbours Butebo District to the North, Kibuku to the West, Mbale to the East, and Butaleja to the South.
