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ABSTRACT

This report contains and describe the activities implemented, skills and qualifications gained, challenges faced during industrial training, conclusions and recommendations derived from the challenges faced at Light Force International. The main objectives are to sustain livelihood and thus LFI opened up an Agricultural school to equip the youth of the rural area to be effective in farming. During industrial Training I was attached to various sections such as Poultry, Cattle and goats, Piggery and Horticulture. While at the various units, I gained skills and knowledge such as hand milking, preparation of a nursery bed and management of seedlings, how to operate various machines such as a milling machine and a threshing machine as well as general management of livestock. During Internship I faced challenges such as difficulties in operating some machines in the farm, poor transport due to bad roads in Omito Village and long distance to the piggery units which was far from the main farm. In conclusion all the activities were implemented and industrial training was successfully carried out. ight Force International—Lirais aChristian base organization founded by Preacher of word (missionary) Sir George Ronald Ridnil which was founded in 2003 under Light agency in UK. LFI has worked in Lira, northern Uganda since January 2004 initially working in the displaced peoples camps at the height of the rebel insurgency which devastated people's lives. After a holding peace was in place, those displaced moved back to their land.

LFI supported the return process and worked with communities with special emphasis on the education and health sector. LFI has enjoyed partnership with World Food Programme (WFP), UNICEF and Memisa Belgium

Since 2007 LFI has purchased land and developed projects in Telela, Omito Parish Lira. Whereby over 50 local people have been employed to support the running of the project which included Agricultural and vocational schools, Nursery and Primary schools, Children's village, Visitor's center and Community Health Center. We Farm 140 hectares with a mixture of crop and livestock.
