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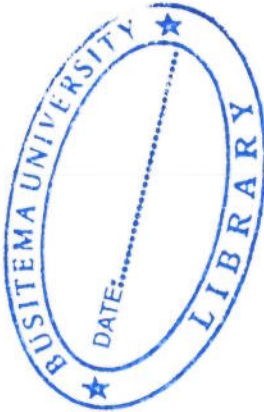





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## ABSTRACT

This is a report of what was carried out in Soroti District Local Government during the internship.
