
#### **ABSTRACT:**

Karamoja Christian Ethno veterinary Program is a Non-Governmental Organization operating in Nabilatuk and Lolachat sub counties. It is composed of board of trustees, secretariats, field workers and communities. This organization undertakes a lot of activities that include use of Ethnoveterinary drugs like Albizia anthelmentica for deworming, Animal health, poultry projects, Agro forestry, field work, evangelism and business development skills.

The Organization intends to see that the indigenous knowledge of the Karamojong Agro Pastoralists of using local herbs is adversely used in order to promote improved health of the animals and re-establishment of the natives into a sustainable Agro pastoral communities.

During my attachment period, I was involved in a lot of activities that involved: use of Ethno veterinary drugs for Animal health for example use Albizia anthelmentica for deworming, extension activities for example visit of chicken farmers, field work, office work, and community sensitization.

However, in my efforts to fulfill animal health activity which included treatment of animals, I found out that the major diseases that were affecting these animals were: Anaplasmosis(LOPID), contagious bovine pleuropneumonia (CBPP), East coast fever (E.C.F), however mature animals seemed to be a little resistant to some of these diseases compared to that young ones which had a high mortality rate. These diseases could be possible to control only if the local herbs are used to completely eliminate tick multiplication by use of Ebuto other than the use of commercial pharmaceuticals and the introduction of grazing systems in the area.



### **CHAPTER ONE**

### **1.0 Introduction**

I reported to Karamojong Christian Ethno veterinary Program (KACHEP) ON 28<sup>th</sup> Feb to 22<sup>th</sup> April where I was given opportunity to carry out my industrial training. The program focuses on empowering the nomadic Karamojong herders to manage their Livestock, families and environment in a way that can blend their indigenous knowledge and belief with the changing world around them.

The program was started in 1998 with Ethno veterinary survey in Bokora and Pian. The chapter includes the background, mission, vision, objectives, organizational structure and activities of the organization.

### **1.1BACKGROUND OF KACHEP:**

Karamoja Christian Ethno Veterinary Program(KACHEP) was formally known by the name world concern/Christian veterinary mission(WC/CVM). this was the body that founded it. however, because of the withdrawal from WC, KACHEP had to register as a local NGO.it was handed over as a local NGO in May 2004.WC is a big international organization with its projects covering most country of Africa including Uganda. While CVM was a partner program operating in Uganda under the registered mother NGO WC with its independent source of founding from individuals and churches contribution from the US the program continues with WC/CVM activities.

#### 1.2 MISION

The program strives to see Agro-pastoral people of Karamoja utilize their abundant resources of local herbs and wealth of indigenous knowledge to re-establish themselves into sustainable Agro pastoral communities.

#### 1.3 VISSION:

Communities committed to Christ, respecting one another and God's creation while utilizing their indigenous knowledge to meet their basic needs.
