ABSTRACT

CHAPTER ONE;

1.1 INTRODUCTION.

An industrial training report carried out at Karugwa mixed farm for a period of 10 weeks from 18th may to 31st July 2015.

1.2 Back ground of the farm.

Karugwa mixed farm was established by Mr. Karugwa Timothy as a private farm in the year 2011, with 36 acres of land, the aim was to improving agriculture in both crop and animal enterprises. The farm started with crops like passion fruits and bananas. Animals included cattle, goats and fish farming.

In 2012, the farm expanded its boundaries with 6 acres of land. The farm is currently sited on 43 acres of land with enterprises like 2 Friesian cows on zero grazing system and 21 Ankle breed on a free range system, sheep, Boar goats from South Africa, fish farming mainly Tilapia and Cut fish, poultry mainly broilers, layers and kroilers, apiculture, Piggery production is also practiced under IMO management.

Crops include Chill as the main, passion fruits, bananas, oranges, mangoes.

Karugwa mixed farm is located 24 km North of Kampala city in Kalagala sub-county, Kalagala village 2km off Kampala-Bombo road in Luwero district.
