This chapter gives an overview of the internship period that was conducted in SAA for a period of two month and two weeks that was from 28th February to 6th may 2022. It summarizes the background of the organization structure, project carried out and all activities that are conducted among others

1.1 Background

SAA is a nonprofit making organization funded in 1986 by Dr. Norman Borloug, Mr. Ryoichi Sasakawa and former US president Jimmy Carter which used to be SG2000 works in close collaboration with national agriculture extension services in Ethiopia, Mali, Nigeria, and Uganda to support smallholder farmers along agriculture value chain. SAA aims to increase farmer's income and food nutrition security through linking smallholder farmers to markets and reducing post-harvest losses. Sasakawa envisions a more food-secure in rural Africa with increasing numbers of prospering smallholder commercial farmers. Its vision is to support Africa to fulfill its aspiration in building resilient and sustainable food systems and mission is to catalyze knowledge sharing with African farmers and enabling food nutrition and income security in their communities.

Sasakawa African Association was established in Uganda in1996 and signed MoU with government through Ministry of Agriculture Animal industry and Fisheries. The mandate and approached of the Sasakawa African Association realized through collaboration with other key stakeholders to promote agricultural and community development.
