ABSTRACT

This is a composition of four different chapters which introduce the reader to statements details of activities accomplished during industrial training from 28/ Feb to03/May 2022 at Rwentuha town council in Bushenyl district. Chapter one introduces the reader about the background information of the attachment organisation and objectives of the agency. Chapter two describes sensitising crop farmers on coffee berry disease, coffee wilt and banana weevils, banana production and agronomic practices like planting and gap filling, de-suckering, earthling up, staking, pruning, manuring, thinning. Agronomic practices in pineapples like training and pruning, staking and trellising a visit on various farms such as onions and sukuma fields, tomato, cabbage fields and also at demonstration site for maize where different practices were carried out fertilizer application and meetings and monitoring. CHAPTER ONE

1.0 INTRODUCTION

The industrial training was carried out from the 28th of Feb to the 27th of April at Rwentuhatown council under supervision of the Agricultural officer of the location.

1.1 BACKGROUND OF RWENTUHA TOWN COUNCIL

LOCATION

Recention town council is among the town council's found in Bushenyi district. It's located along kabwohe-BUSHENYI highway lokm from kabwohe and 5km BUSHENYI town with area coverage of 91km².

It has three Ward's that's Kitwe Ward, Rwentuha Ward and Rutooma Ward.

POPULATION

Rwentuha town council has a bigger population of over 11,660 people by the census results, but as the 2014 Uganda and housing census, the figure stands at 9937 people with 5305 male against 4632 females.

ECONOMIC ACTIVITIES

The people of the town council are involved in subsistence farming where crops like cassava, maize, Bean's, sweet potatoes and bananas are grown and grazing a number of animals.

The town council has a market and numerous trading centres where most shopping is done on daily basis.

The town council have got two companies namely kituzi company and Hunter beverages East Africa fimited where most youth are employed.

TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION

The town council enjoys good feeder road hetworks having been opened up and maintained by both town council administration and Bushenyi local government.

However communication is very poor where most of the public phones are found at developed trading centres. There is public service vehicles along the roads, the transport mechanism is privately owned motorcyclists named 'Boda Boda'.
