
On Monday, 5th December 2022, Hon. Fred Bwino delivered the Government message to commemorate the World Soils day at Busitema University.

Prof. Paul Waako VC Busitema University



r Justin Ekou (PhD), a Veterinary Surgeon, is a well read man and vast educational accomplishments. He holds a bachelor's degree in Veterinary Medicine, a Master's degree of Science in Molecular Biology and Bio-Technology and a PhD in Veterinary Medicine, all from the great hill of Makerere.

He also holds a Certificate in Public Administration and Management and another Certificate in Educational Law.

He has 14 years of teaching practice. His career

journey began in 2008 as a Teaching Assistant in the Department of Veterinary medicine at Makerere University. He spent 3 years before moving to Busitema in 2010 as an Assistant Lecturer.

He has risen through the ranks and is currently a Senior Lecturer in the Department of Animal Production and Management.

He ascended to the helm of leadership at Arapai Campus as a Faculty Dean in January 2020.

The faculty currently runs programs at the



Despite the various achievements, the Dean pointed out several challenges and setbacks: Staffing challenges with few full-time staff result in over-dependence on part-time staff.

The faculty holds a large population of 2700 students in limited accommodation, some of which are in dire need of refurbishment.

His plans for the future include lobbying for additional resources and creating other alternative funding sources like research grants and other off-budget funding.

The faculty is also considering expansion regarding academic programs.

They have submitted to NCHE, waiting for approval, including a Master of Science in Plant Breeding, Global Changes and Sustainable Agriculture, a PhD in the same field, a Master of Science in Veterinary

certificate, Diploma and Undergraduate levels.

As Faculty Dean, he has participated in

redesigning the teaching of practical sessions, moving it from the department to a farm and integrating the farm as a teaching unit.

He has seen the establishment of a modern dairy unit that started with seven Freshian cows, operationalized a modern poultry unit and set up 50 acres of pasture land and is training students in feeding preservations of pasture, and expanded the piggery units.

Pharmacology and Toxicology, a Master of Science in Animal Production, a Master of Science in Agricultural Economics and finally a Masters in Agribusiness.

The faculty is also considering the expansion and establishment of new departments.

There is a plan to establish two schools in the faculty, a School of Agriculture and Animal Resources.

From our interaction with him, we learnt that the Dean was an achiever, result-oriented, a hard worker, and enjoys fresh fish and Kalo.

### Tell us About Yourself?

I am a Civil Engineer by training and a Registered Engineer with the Uganda Engineers Registration Board.

> I officially joined Busitema University in 2009. Prior to this, I had a consultancy gig with Warner Consultants.

> > In 2012, I became the acting Head the Department of Agricultural Mechanization and Irrigation Engineering up to 2014.

In 2016 I enrolled for my PhD at the University of KwaZulu-Natal, which I completed in 2019.

### What are Some of the projects the faculty has undertaken?

By the time I joined Busitema in 2009, finding room to conduct lectures was challenging; at times, over 10 staff had to squeeze into offices meant for two persons.

The first major project was the ADB IV project which was rolled out at the Main Campus and Nagongera. Through the project, we got a fully-fledged faculty block with laboratories, office space and numerous lecture halls.

Internet connectivity has also greatly improved compared to when I joined Busitema in 2009.

Despite the inelastic resource envelope, we have been able to work on several projects presented at exhibitions on the national and international stages.

Under the Department of Argo-processing Engineering, the members of that department were able to develop a round-the-clock solar crop/ animal product drying machine that dries food crops and meat, which has generated a lot of interest from the community and members countrywide.

We are looking to scale it up to at least benefit the nearby community under the Parish Development Model (PDM). This project helps extend the shelf life of food products like meat, bananas, cassava, sweet potatoes, and other fresh food and crop.



We also have a remote-controlled mortuary robot developed by the Department of Computer Engineering students with guidance from their lecturers. This project was ranked third countrywide and second in the international competitions held in Dubai. As a university, we would wish to scale it further, but we have challenges with resources.



A remote-controlled mortuary robot to assist the health personnel in the mortuary and the general hospital works like cleaning the mortuary and autopsy rooms, cleaning the infectious dead bodies, disinfection of conterminous areas in the hospital, food deliveries in the wards with deadly diseases like TB, Ebola, COVID-19


The Agricultural Mechanization and Irrigation Engineering department developed a ground nut stripping machine. Once the groundnuts have been harvested, it helps separate the leaves and stalks from the pods.



The chicken de-feathering machine is another project that has generated much interest from the community because it can de-feather over five chicken in under a minute.

During the pandemic, our students had a problem finding placement for industrial training, so we had to simulate what happens in the field/ work environment at the university. Through this project, we were able to pave the walkway to the Main Administration Block with the help of the students, which cost us





only eleven million compared to the over one hundred million we would have spent if we had employed a contractor.

The gymnasium was also worked upon under this project, but our biggest challenges are the limited resources because we have bigger plans as a university.

## Plans for the faculty

We have over 61 engineers employed within the faculty, and if you look at the National Development Plan (NDP) III, infrastructure development is one of the core areas that will lead to the transformation of this country.

The university has a company, the Busitema University Fund, and we would like to have something similar at the faculty level.

Something that will help us generate resources so that we can do much more and reduce overdependence on the government.

We intend to set up a consultancy firm under the faculty, and teams are benchmarking with CEDAT at Makerere University, which has a consultancy firm known as Technology Consults.

We are also benchmarking with Makerere University Agricultural Research institute Kabanyoro (MUARIK) by looking at their business models because they generate money that benefits them and the university.

So we want to contribute to the resource envelope of the university.

### **Your** Principles

I believe in family and am married with three children. Raising children, I have seen the effect of the principles I stand by.

I stand for fairness and objectivity in whatever I do. Unfortunately, that has also caused me lots of problems; at times, you're trying to be objective, and people want to sway you and make you look at things in a subjective way, and at times I end up locking horns with some people, but I try my level best to not be swayed from the right track.

### Final remarks

I encourage the students to work hard amidst the daily challenges they face. We are committed to giving our students high quality hands on training.

## The Genesis of TAZCOV

The idea of Tazcov Herbal product was conceived by Dr Samuel Baker Obakiro, PhD in April 2020 at Busitema University Faculty of Health Sciences after the Covid-19 pandemic had hit Uganda and there was a desperate need to search for an ideal therapeutic agent against Covid-19.



To develop an effective, safe and quality natural therapeutic, Dr Obakiro (Innovator) shared the idea with Prof. Paul Waako (Clinical Pharmacologist), who advised that a multidisciplinary research team is created to pursue this project. Scientists with the required expertise within the University were recruited

to support the project.

Dr Nakiyemba is a straightforward, hardworking leader who puts her work first and works relentlessly to achieve results. This has helped her complete several projects, the most interesting being the current one. Under her stewardship, the faculty has completed two projects about landslides on Mt Elgon. The first one was a two-year project called A south initiative on landslides.

The next was a fiveyear team project about landslides on Mt Elgon. The faculty also completed a project of three years in the Rwenzori region about landslides. The Belgium

government funded these projects.

The faculty also completed a project on rodents which focuses on the ecologically based management of rodents without poisoning them but using ecologically favourable means. The

project has been tried in districts like Mayuge and Butaleja. It was funded by the Bill and Belinda Gates Foundation in collaboration with so koine university of agriculture. Around the campus, the faculty is working with the community to produce low energy-saving stoves and a tree planting project to save the climate under threat.

Many more projects are coming up, like the land use projects by the Ministry of Agriculture, and one of their plans is to do a cost-saving project, and farmers get to use their local materials.



A stakeholders workshop on 30th August 2022 aimed at developing training programmes at the institute. Representatives from Uganda National Roads Authority attended it, the Ministry of Works, UPDF, and Mahanthi Uganda Ltd.

The current project she termed the most interesting for her is looking at women as front liners of climate change in the Butaleja district.

This project focuses on women and how floods affect their well-being.

### **Challenges**


Many projects in the Lake, like fish farming, fail to come to fruition due to the lack of a gazetted area.

The National Environment Management Authority (NEMA) is meant to permit them to gazette a site for their research and projects to which fishermen will not have access.

## Achievements during tenure in the Directorate of Quality Assurance.

The Directorate produced guidelines for academic programmes review and development customised to the University following national and international standards.

Tools and frameworks were designed for conducting and evaluating teaching, examination moderation, ODeL, support services and governance. Evaluations at all levels, including Management, University Council, and Senate and feedback reports were introduced. All these documents were approved by Council and are currently in use.

Annual University Assessments, Graduate Tracer Studies and Employers Satisfaction Surveys were conducted, and an implementation matrix was developed. The Directorate of Quality Assurance constantly and periodically monitors the progress in performance and ranking of several units in the University. We initiated the ISO process, and we hope the University will achieve this important milestone of being ISO accredited soon.

The Directorate of Quality Assurance set up Quality Assurance committees at the Faculty

and teamwork. University rankings and visibility were tracked, and stakeholders were informed on areas requiring improvement.

## Plans for the Finance and Administration Department.

As the DVC (Finance and Administration), she commits to champion transformations that shall be guided by 5 targets:

- (i) Human resource optimisation shall involve encouraging our staff to commit to doing more for optimal productivity. Our team shall have clear staff duty assignments and precise descriptions of workloads, targets, expected outputs, and objective output evaluation and impact metrics.
- (ii) Staff and Students' attraction and retention: This will involve heightening stakeholders' engagement and good management practices. We hope to attract and retain highly motivated quality staff. Our team will strengthen efforts towards staff career growth for our prolific researchers. This will amplify our ability to attract funds, enhance academic excellence and improve our ability to engage in emerging higher education trends. Equally, we shall lay strategies to increase student enrollment and continuous improvement of service delivery to our stakeholders.
- (iii) Financial saving: This shall entail doing more with less. Together as a team, we will implement Cost-Saving and Quality-Enhancing Reforms. All of us at Busitema University must commit to maximising the effective and efficient use of our resources. To help us achieve a good balance of revenue and expenditure for sustainability.
- (iv) Evidence-based institutional decisions: This shall demand leadership with reform-based practices centred on publicly available and sharable data coming from all pillars of the core and support functions of the University.
- (v) Program/Development prioritisation: This will be done through; (i) maintaining and reshaping existing programs/and development, (ii) undertaking a costbenefit analysis of emerging programs and development needs; and (ii) implementing relevant, unique, distinctive programs and development initiatives. To reduce pressure on the University and enhance the streamlining of university priorities in line with the National Development Goals.

### **Recent Awards received**

The Acting DVC still maintains a physical presence in the lecture room, research and publication. Recently she won a prestigious grant from OWSD for a project on Energy recovery from solid waste and water treatment.

This project is an integrated approach to addressing the concepts of the 3Es (Energy, Environment and Economics) and 3Rs (Reduce, Reuse and Recycle). The project is expected to enhance university partnerships and collaboration with the community and industries.

In addition, the project is geared towards Staff Development for Change to Problem-Based Learning and Project Based Learning supported by Busitema University Research and Innovation Fund. Dr Biira was recognised last year at a symposium held by FAWoVC led by Professor J.N Okwakol in Zimbabwe. Forum for African Women Vice Chancellors promotes Gender Inclusive Participation in Science, Technology and Innovation in Mozambique, Sudan and Uganda.

Associate Professor also did a PhD at Mbarara University of Science and Technology in Psychology and specialised in mental health, particularly trauma among children, making him an Associate Professor. Mbarara University of Science and Technology awarded this degree, part of it in Germany, in Constance and Belfield, a sandwich program.

In his professional experience, he taught at the National Teachers College at Kaliro for nine years. He was also a Deputy Registrar at Kumi University for

six months, where he helped organise the University charter. Professor's research network was written on the torture of children like refugees, published and presented in Nairobi and Dar-e-salaam. He started a girls' school in Kaliro and recruited girls who had dropped out of school during the COVID-19 period, giving them another hope to study. Professor mainstreams in Psychology and has written three curriculums for Clinical Psychology, including Counselling and Educational Psychology at the Faculty.

He also lectured on Conflicts Psychology at Kyambogo University and wrote the Counselling Psychology curriculum with the National Council for Higher Education, where he has also made institutional visits to access their registration to the council.

He has thirteen publications and supervised thirty

Master and six PhD students. He is a reviewer with a journal of Child Psychology and Trauma. In 2014, he kick-started the Master's program at Busitema University FSE, Nagongera and mobilised lecturers from universities like Makerere and Uganda Management Institute for the program.

Professor's outstanding achievement is the introduction of the Higher Education Access Certificate (HEAC). With the program (HEAC), he involved the Federation of African Women Education

(FAWE) and MasterCard Foundation, which gave consent and played a leading role in drafting its curriculum, which was launched on the 25th of July, 2019 to date.

He is also an advocate of the HEAC program at other universities. Professor marked the university's land and secured its borders while maintaining a good relationship with the community. He masterminded the planning of the 4000 trees at the Faculty and loves nature.



# Projects in the Faculty of Health Sciences We have a

We have run several projects independently and in conjunction with other universities, including SERVUIAL PLUS with Makerere university, founded by Norway, which trained three PhD students from our campus for five years and supported our Master's students during their dissertations in Public Health.

Makerere University partnered with us in writing a Master's in Medicine (Pediatrics and Child Heath), of which we expect our first grandaunts this year in June.

We have another grant with SEED Global Health which brings educators from the United States to support us in education for quality improvement in maternal and child health, which happens yearly. They are currently supporting emergency obstetric care and paediatric care. Other partnerships include Baby Gel, who are using hand sanitiser to prevent neonatal infection and diarrhoeal diseases in Eastern Uganda

Liverpool University has collaborated with the Faculty in areas of preventing neonatal infections and maternal health.

Prof Wandabwa wants the Faculty to grow into a School of Medicine comprising a Bachelor of Medicine and Surgery and a Bachelor of Anesthesia and Allied Medical Sciences (Bachelor of Nursing and Midwifery, Bachelor of Pharmacy and Bachelor of Laboratory Sciences).

They are looking forward to introducing a Master of Science in Physiology, Pharmacology, Microbiology and Immunology.

Staff are encouraged to write more grants to enhance research and support the Faculty.

Outside the office, Prof Wandabwa is a football fan of Leads United and watches rugby, which he got interested in while at Liverpool University and is a member of the Father's Union and a fully committed churchman. He is very social, believes in keeping in step with his roots, keeps in touch with his village, and enjoys music.

# Agribusiness Innovation Challenge

## Whose idea was the agri-business challenge?

The Agribusiness challenge was an idea by AVSI, whose policy does not give cash but provides the necessary equipment for the winners to build their businesses.

This project is conducted under the department Agribusiness and Extension headed by Dr Ronald Kabbiri. Busitema University not only teaches students textbook knowledge, but it is a hands-on skill training university. A student cannot come to Busitema University and become a job seeker. All our graduates leave when they have set up relevant businesses for the Ugandan and world markets, depending on the individual student's desires and aspirations.

Among the groups, a team started making soap, packaged it and sold it in the neighbouring villages and the university canteen.




### Joel's Poultry production and management

started in June 2020 with 15 local birds in one room with the aim of producing local eggs to supply nearby hotels. They offer local eggs and meat to the hotels. Besides eggs and meat, they provide chicken droppings to pig farmers to feed pigs on their farms. The project has slowly increased to the total number of 55 birds covering 3 rooms.

#### Asha Briquettes Enterprise is a start-up

SMART CLIMATE enterprise which was started on 1/10/2022. This project was created to pass a course unit on Agribusiness. However, along the way, the product became of great importance since it became a substitute for charcoal. Briquettes are cost-effective and play a great role in reducing tree cutting. The business requires limited capital to set up because most of the materials necessary for the company can easily be accessed in our communities at no cost, e.g. groundnut shells, peelings from any food, cow dung, and maize cobs, among others.





#### **Rush Mushrooms Enterprise**

#### **Doreen and Sons Enterprise**

was started on 7/09/2021. The business began with 100 chicks. The core business is to supply eggs to students of Arapai. The current turnover is about 40,000/= shillings per day from 3 trays of eggs daily.



#### **Blessed Mushroom Limited**







Blessed mushroom limited started in 2021 after observational difficulties caused by COVID-19 that made it difficult to access nutritious food due to the close-up of many businesses within the country and the need for household income and climatic changes that affect open land agriculture production.

It was an initiative to provide cheap sources of

proteins, vitamins, carbohydrates, and a wide range of mineral salts required for healthy body growth and increasing body immunity to children and adults. The product was easily accessed in the markets and supper markets. The business offers products and services like Fresh and dry mushrooms, Valueadded mushroom products, and Training people in mushroom cultivation.



On the table above, we have fresh and dry mushrooms produced by Pride fresh mushroom farms, owned by Aliga Peter, a second-year student pursuing a Bachelor of Science in Agriculture.

Pride Fresh mushroom farm is a small-scale business located in the Arapai campus, Soroti district.



This mushroom business is new in the Arapai community aiming at solving the public needs of the mushroom nutritional insecurity. This mushroom business will be focused on bridging the gap of low mushroom production engagements by the locals in the Arapai community, thus meeting the high market demands for mushrooms.

#### **Elaasik Hibiscus Wine**

Process of production from harvest to sorting to processing the final product.











This nutritious Hibiscus wine is produced by Elaasik Hibiscus wine, owned by Kisaale Eddy, a third-year student pursuing a Bachelor of Agribusiness. Elaasik hibiscus wine enterprise\* was started in October 2021 as a sole proprietorship enterprise dealing in the production of hibiscus wine producing 5 litres a month, and is currently producing 20 litres per month, covering the Soroti district.

#### **Yoghurt**



Ashante yoghurt is made by Ejok Edeke Enterprises, owned by Ongwal Jacob, a second-year student pursuing a Bachelor of Science in Agriculture. Ejok business enterprise, the producers of Asante yoghurt, started its production in 2022. It is a new small-scale start-up business located in Busitema university Arapai campus to produce organic yoghurt for consumption by students, staff of Busitema University and the community of Arapai whose deliveries are door to door.

Their plans include supplying the outer bigger markets like supermarkets. Currently, the business is owned and run by one person but with the intention to expand, train and employ more workers due to the overwhelming demand for the product.

#### c) HIGHER EDUCATION ACCESS CERTIFICATE PROGRAMMES:

Higher Education Access Certificate (HEAC) is the 4th Higher Education access route to provide entry opportunity for candidates who sat for UACE but do not have appropriate qualifications based on current National admission criteria for higher education and those with foreign qualifications but do not merit admission to programmes at higher institutions of learning in Ugandan Education system.

The programme runs for two semesters (one year), and focuses on preparation of candidates in specific subjects that provide specific and generic academic skills to succeed in higher education system in the desired programmes.

#### Eligibility/Entry Requirements to the programme

- (i) Uganda Advanced Certificate of Education (UACE) holders with at least two subsidiary passes or its equivalent. At least one of the subsidiary pass shall be from a principal subject.
- (ii) Vocational Qualifications at level 2 or level 3 of the Uganda Vocational Qualifications Framework.
- (iii) Qualifications equivalent to Uganda Advanced Certificate of Education (UACE) as shall be determined by the National Council for Higher Education (NCHE) in consultation with Uganda National Examinations Board (UNEB).
- (iv) Students with foreign secondary school qualifications not considered equivalent to UACE; such students shall have passed at least five subjects with a minimum overall grade of C (equivalently a Ugandan grade 5)

Applicants MUST make a print out of the application form and attach certified copies of the transcript, certificate, diploma and degree; birth certificate, one (1) passport size photo to be submitted to any of the following centers: Busitema campus (25km from Tororo), Busitema University Liaison Office (Makerere University, Lincoln Flats, Room A2), Arapai Campus in Soroti, Namasagali Campus in Kamuli, Nagongera Campus in Tororo, Pallisa Campus (at Kalaki) in Pallisa & Mbale Campus (Mbale Regional Referral Hospital) not later than the annual stated deadline. All copies of academic transcripts must be certified by the awarding institutions and not Photocopies of Certified documents.

#### NB:

- 1. All Admitted Candidates will be responsible for verification of their Academic documents from awarding institution.
- 2. A non refundable application fee for PhD programmes is UgX 200,000 for East Africans and UgX 300,000 for non East Africans.
- 3.
